Centering Health Equity

Discover how ACS is centering health equity within the Roundtables. During this session, you will have the chance to evaluate your organization's efforts in promoting health equity and utilize ACS tools to pinpoint strategies for advancing health equity in your own work.

Stages of Changes Model to Health Equity Assessment

- 1. Precontemplation: Awareness of health equity, but no planned movement / activities in the next 6 12 months.
- 2. Contemplation: Some discussion of health equity within the organization, plans to strategize in next 6 months
- 3. Preparation: health equity is a key priority of the organization and is being integrated into the strategic plan / workplan.
- 4. Action: Have identified key activities and are currently implementing health equity into HPV
