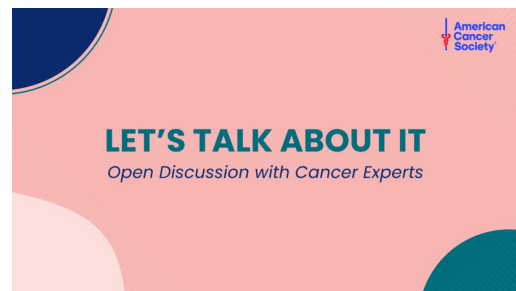

### Abstract Submissions Open: 2025 National HPV Conference

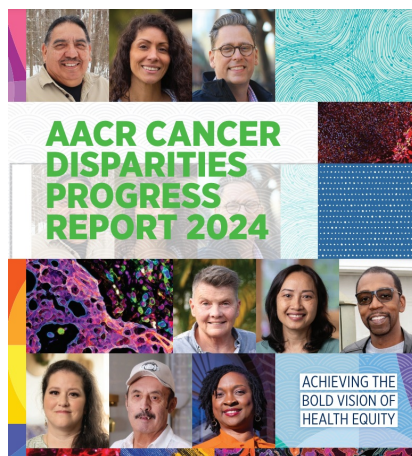
The first National HPV Conference is now accepting abstracts! NHPVC is aimed at those working in HPV prevention, screening, diseases, and cancer control. We are most interested in abstracts that highlight successful projects, collaborations, and practices that will be useful to various stakeholders. Abstracts must be submitted by September 15, 2024.

### National Estimates of the Participation of Patients with Cancer in Clinical Research Studies Based on Commission on Cancer Accreditation Data

National estimates of cancer clinical trial participation are nearly two decades old and have focused solely on enrollment to treatment trials, which does not reflect the willingness of patients to contribute to other elements of clinical research. Unger et al. determined inclusive, contemporary estimates of clinical trial participation for adults with cancer using a national sample of data from the Commission on Cancer (CoC).
