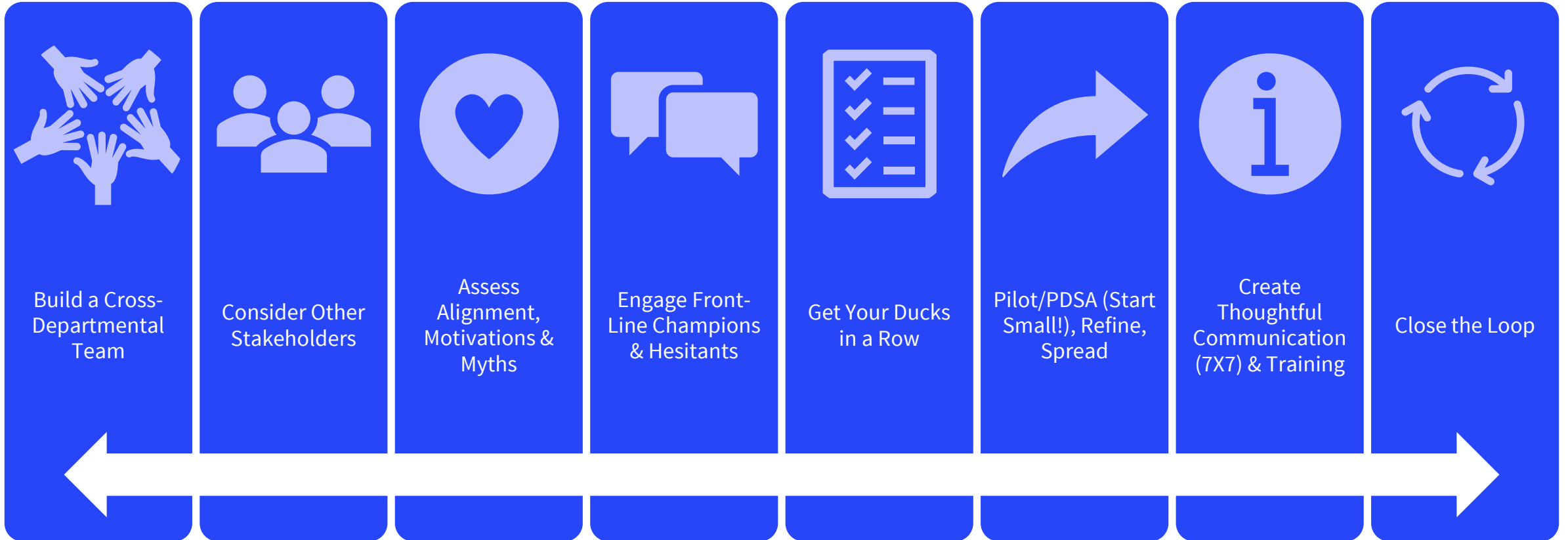

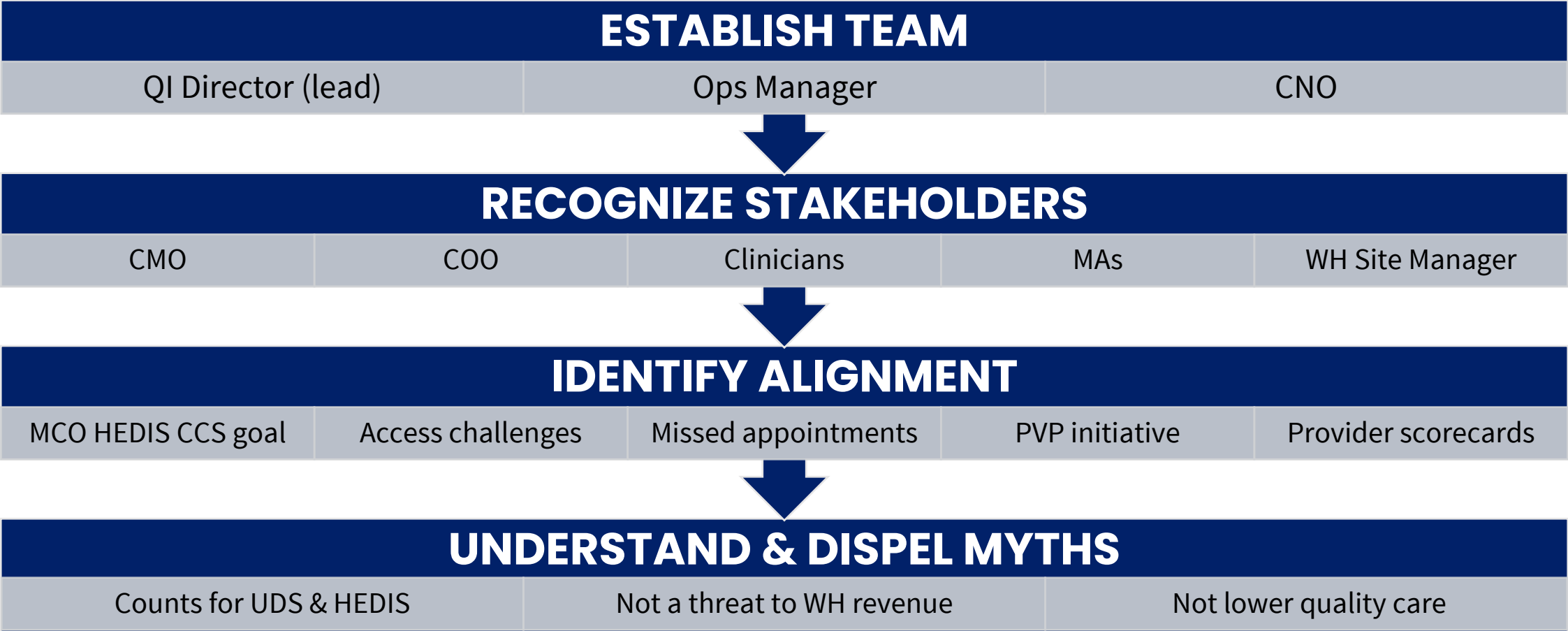

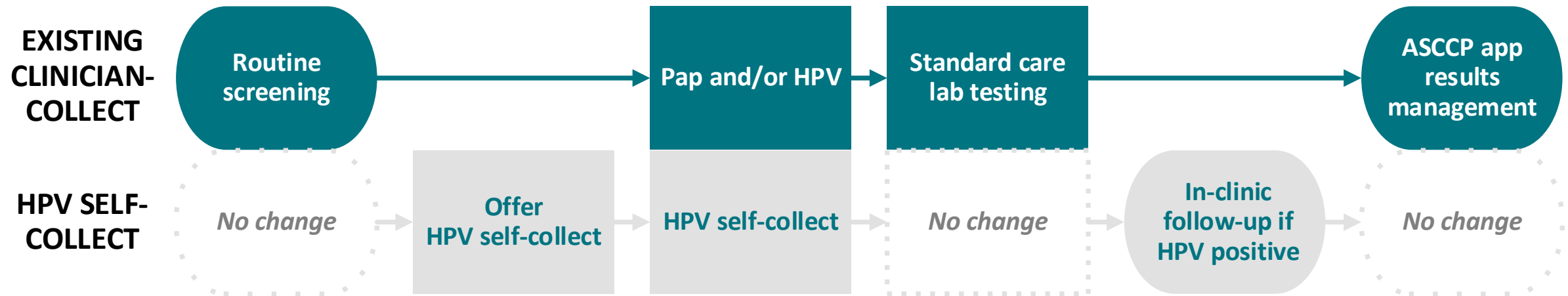
HPV Self-Collection Readiness

- Keep it simple!

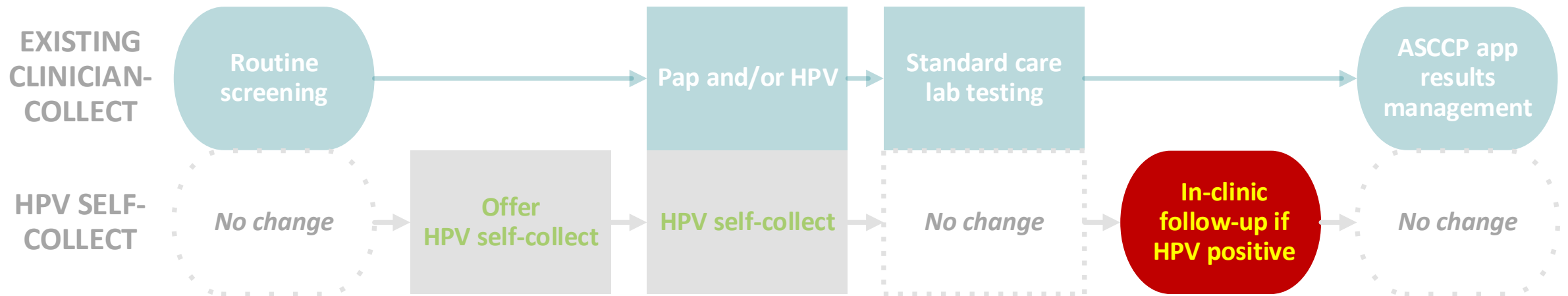

HPV Self-Collection Readiness



- Laboratory capacity
- Metrics
- Reimbursement/billing
- QI Team/stakeholder assembly

Laboratory Capacity

- **Does your laboratory offer HPV self-collection?**
 - **Sell sheet:** CPT, LOINC, collection instructions, stability
 - **Build sheet:** *if programming interface*
 - **Supplies:** kits, collection device, ThinPrep, instructions



- **NCQA intention based on billing code and measure specification**
- **HEDIS**
 - "Member-collected samples" explicitly covered since 2025¹
- **UDS**
 - HRSA explicit inclusion language proposed 10/1/2025²
 - BCCP is at the state level -- usually overlap for CCS

Reimbursement/Billing



- **Self-collect = CPT-87626**
- **Some states have not adopted the new code – continue to use existing CPT-87624**

QI Team / Stakeholder Assembly



- **Engage EHR programmers**
- **Engage women's health team**

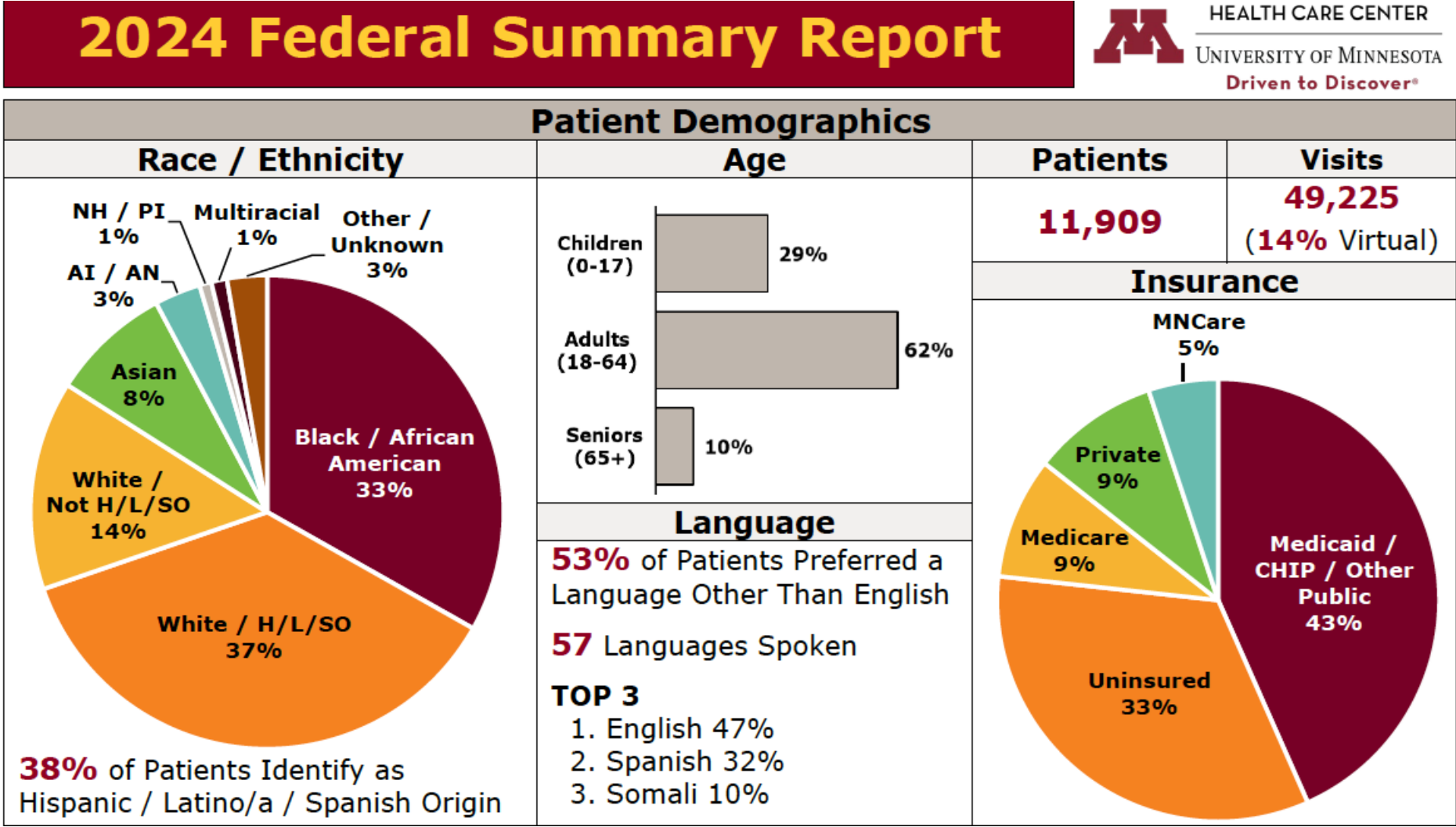

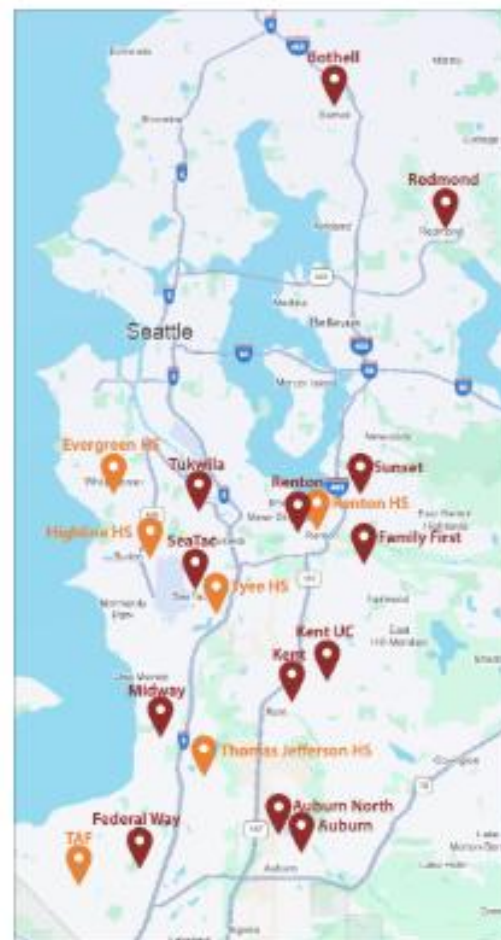
